Angelina Ballerina Next Steps: ages 4-12 Angelina continues her dance training at age 8. Celebrate music and the arts.

Dinosaur Train ages 3-6. The series helps apply scientific thinking as kids discover dinosaur species, compare and contrast them to today's creatures and learn about paleontology and the natural sciences.

The Electric Company ages 6-9. Hey you guuuuuyssss! The Electric Company is back! Designed with a focus on 2nd grade reading, The Electric Company creates immersive, hip and funny literary learning experiences.

FETCH! With Ruff Ruffman ages 6-10. Part game show, part reality TV, and part spoof, FETCH! features real kids and real science with host Ruff Ruffman.

Franny's Feet: ages 4-7. The animated 5 year old Franny goes on a magical adventure to destinations around the globe based on the shoes she tries on. She meets new friends and tries to help them solve problems.

Martha Speaks ages 4-7. Based on the children's book series about Martha the talking dog, the series focuses on the power of speech and the ability to communicate through oral language.

PEEP and the Big Wide World: ages 3-5. Peep, and his friends Chirp and Quack teach pre-schoolers about science through their daily adventures.

Sesame Street ages 2-5. Children learn over 200 educational and social concepts with fun characters that live on Sesame Street.

Sid the Science Kid ages 3-6. From Jim Henson Studios, Sid the Science Kid uses music and humor about science in everyday life to promote exploration, discovery and science readiness for preschoolers.

Super Why! ages 3-7. Storybook Village characters Wyatt Beanstalk and his Super Hero friends solve fairy tale problems by using ABCs, words, spelling, comprehension and vocabulary.

Thomas & Friends ages 3-5. Watch Thomas and the other engines! Stories focus on manners, hard work, and being a really useful engine.

WordGirl ages 4-12. Superhero WordGirl fights crime and builds vocabulary. Each episode introduces 2-4 new vocabulary words and uses various superhero scenarios to reinforce the words' meanings.

Word World ages 2-6. Brings words to life with fun characters and words that are built into the objects that they represent. Introduces key early literacy skills.
