

CELEBRATE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES DAY!



Indigenous Peoples' Day is a holiday in the United States that celebrates and honors indigenous American peoples and commemorates their histories and cultures. It is celebrated across the United States on the second Monday in October. In 2021, Joe Biden formally commemorated the holiday with a presidential proclamation, becoming the first U.S. president to do so.

Locally On June 14, 2022, the City of Rochester along with full Mayoral support, voted unanimously to replace Columbus Day with only Indigenous Peoples Day in the City of Rochester. On October 10, 2022, the city celebrated Rochester's first annual Indigenous Peoples Day. On October 07, 2022, the resolution to the initial proclamation was read and the Haudenosaunee Flag was raised.
