A Tale of Two Cities

We have explored how Rochester is "a tale of two cities." On one side, our community boasts incredible innovation, some of the best academic institutions in America, comfortable living environments, relatively low unemployment rates, and plenty of recreational opportunities. Yet on the other side, the <u>2020 Act</u> <u>Rochester Hard Facts Update</u> highlights significant disparities across our region that disproportionately affect Black and Latino people For example, we have one of the highest rates of childhood poverty in the nation. For adults, African Americans are almost three times as likely to be unemployed, three times as likely to live in poverty, and earn incomes that are less than half of whites in the region.


