Awards and Judging

All submissions are judged by a jury and finalists will have their films shown at the Little Theatre. Filmmakers selected as part of this year's festival will also have a chance to earn one of the following four awards, each of which comes with a cash prize:

The Philip Seymour Hoffman Award

This award honors the life and legacy of the late Academy Award-winning actor and Fairport native. It is given to the teen whose film is chosen by the judges as "Best of Fest."

Alex Ketchek Award for Best Animated Film

Presented in memory of Alex Ketchek, a 2010 Rochester Teen Film Festival finalist who tragically passed away in 2013. Presented by the Ketchek family and Animatus Studio.

The Jack Garner Award for Best Director

This award is presented in memory of long time Rochester Teen Film Festival jury member and beloved national film critic, Jack Garner.


The Marilyn O'Connor Award



Scouting for Toys #1-4 airs 10/6 at 1 p.m.—Scouting for Toys is a documentary series that follows the work of Vectis Toys Auctioneers, the UK's largest toy and collectables auctioneer. The show offers a behind-the-scenes look at the auction house, where buyers and sellers from around the world come to trade toys and collectibles.

(New Series) Citizen Nation airs Tuesdays at 8 p.m.—PBS announces the innovative new documentary series. The four-part program is an inspiring coming-of-age story that follows teenagers from across the U.S. with diverse personal and political backgrounds as they come together to compete in the nation's premier civics competition, "We the People." The series shadows high school students over ten months across eight states as they grapple with critical questions about democracy. As the students rise through regional and state competitions, responding to judges' challenges in the style of Congressional hearings, they reveal their knowledge of the U.S. Constitution and politics, and wrestle with what it means to be a citizen today. Along the way, this new generation discovers what it means to show up, be civil and tackle some big issues straight on. Hitchcock Confidential airs 10/19 at 9 p.m.—The name Hitchcock recalls not one but two extraordinary characters: Alfred and his wife, Alma. While he was the celebrated director, Alma was in the background supporting his productions as an editor and screenwriter. Through their close personal and professional relationship, the Hitchcocks developed their own art of storytelling, staging, and production.
