Alex Ketchek Award for Best Animated Film

Presented in memory of Alex Ketchek, a 2010 Rochester Teen Film Festival finalist who tragically passed away in 2013. Presented by the Ketchek family and Animatus Studio.

The Jack Garner Award for Best Director

This award is presented in memory of long time Rochester Teen Film Festival jury member and beloved national film critic, Jack Garner.

The Marilyn O'Connor Award

Marilyn O'Connor has been fighting for equity and justice throughout her life – and this award goes to the film that best addresses a social issue through the lens of compassion.





America the Bountiful (Season 2) - starting Saturdays 4/5 at 2 p.m.—America the Bountiful takes viewers on a weekly journey into America's heartland to learn about culture and find inspiration in the personal, emotionally moving chronicles of farmers, artisans, restauranteurs, and home cooks through the fare that they grow, produce, and eat. Host Capri Cafaro meets guests who share culturally diverse and untold food stories and traditions.

Going Your Way airs 4/5 at 3 p.m.—focuses on the personal, medical, and spiritual issues surrounding end-of-life care, the options available, and steps that can be taken to put those wishes to practical use. The documentary's title highlights the active role many people are now taking to ensure their death goes according to their own plans and wishes. End-of-life planning doesn't have to be painful. We'll learn from the experts and real people who have stories to share about preparing for life and death.

The Piping Plovers of Moonlight Bay airs 4/10 at 3 p.m.—The Piping Plovers of Moonlight Bay is a captivating documentary that follows a pair of courageous Piping Plovers and their blended brood of chicks. Raising tiny, marshmallow-sized baby birds on a crowded urban beach is a perilous occupation and the family overcomes many life-threatening obstacles in this heartwarming film about adaptation, survival and conservation.

<u>Letters from Brno</u> airs 4/14 at 9 p.m.—The powerful story of parental love and unspeakable sacrifice during the Holocaust. In an expansive 45-year search for clues to her mother's hidden past, a daughter uncovers the tragic fate of her grandparents through their letters written during the brutal Nazi occupation of Czechoslovakia.

<u>The Corridors of Power</u> airs 4/14 at 10 p.m.—What happens in the White House when reports arrive of foreign leaders murdering their own people en masse? "The Corridors of Power" investigates this over the past 40 years from Iraq to Syria and Bosnia to Kosovo, how did US policy leave millions to die and how did it influence World Politics Today?

Whitstable Pearl airs 4/17 at 9 p.m. and 4/19 at 11 p.m.—follows single mother Pearl (Kerry Godliman, After Life) as she pursues her lifelong dream to start a private detective agency, which she runs from her family restaurant in the coastal English town of Whitstable. Drawn by her caring nature, locals soon flock to her with all kinds of cases. But when a friend dies suspiciously, Pearl finds herself in conflict with a gruff new cop in town, DCI Mike McGuire (Howard Charles, The Musketeers). In time, the two strike up an understanding, and the possibility of a romantic relationship emerges.

Resistance: They Fought Back airs 4/18 at 4 p.m.—People have a myth stuck in their heads that during the Holocaust, Jews went to their deaths "like sheep to the slaughter." But this is where the real story begins. Jews did not go as sheep to the slaughter. They fought back.

<u>Environmental Connections</u> airs 4/21 and 4/25 at 3 p.m.— host Jasmin Singer explores the climate-related topics affecting people in Rochester and beyond.

From the impact of food choices and electrification to the future of rainfall and the choice of whether to have children, "Environmental Connections" discusses what matters — and what should — when it comes to environmental preservation.

<u>Single-Use Planet</u> airs 4/21 at 9 p.m.—Plastic is vital to our modern way of life—but not all forms of it. In search of why more single-use plastic debris enters the ocean each year despite all recycling efforts, SINGLE-USE PLANET goes upstream in the U.S. to where millions of tons of raw plastic are being made with generous government support. How have other countries solved for the pollution? The quest eventually leads to France.

Water for Life airs 4/21 at 10 p.m.—Follow Indigenous community leaders in Latin America as they face death threats and murder while fighting to save their precious water resources from mining and hydroelectric projects.

Frontline "Alaska's Vanishing Native Villages" airs 4/22 at 10 p.m.—Alaska Native villages fighting for survival against climate change. FRONTLINE and the Howard Center at ASU examine why communities are relocating and struggling to preserve their traditions.

FROM THE ROOTS OF HATRED, THE SEEDS OF CHANGE











The Cure for Hate airs 4/7 at 9 p.m.—In recent years hatred has dominated headlines and national conversation unlike anything seen for decades – a chilling wake up call for those that had convinced themselves such days were behind us. With hate crimes and hate group activity in ascendancy, and an alarming vitriolic shift in public discourse around issues of race and nationalism, the question so many seem to be asking is "how did we get here, and how do we turn back the tide?" Tony McAleer has spent over a decade helping others to understand the dynamics of hate. He should know: in the 1980s, he was deeply involved in the neo-Nazi White Aryan Resistance, anti-immigrant activism, Holocaust denial and street violence. In the 1990s, he attracted increasing notoriety through a series of publicity stunts and by running a white supremacist phone line. His pathway back was a long, lonely and difficult one – an experience that led to him and a small group of other formers to create the organization Life After Hate in order to help others exit hate groups with more support and greater success

<u>We Want the Funk</u> airs 4/8 at 9 p.m.—is a syncopated voyage through the history of funk music, spanning from African, soul, and early jazz roots, to its rise into the public consciousness. Featuring James Brown's dynamism, the extraterrestrial funk of George Clinton's Parliament Funkadelic, transformed girl group Labelle, and Fela Kuti's Afrobeat, the story also traces funk's influences on both new wave and hip-hop.

Never Drop The Ball airs 4/11 at 3 p.m.—Explore the journey of Black baseball players during decades of exclusion from Major League Baseball, culminating in Jackie Robinson's 1947 success. Their passion for the game led to the creation of the Negro Major League and Negro American League. Set in an era when Major League Baseball began but was segregated, these players' love for the game transcended Jim Crow laws and adversity.

Chic Featuring Nile Rodgers Jazz a Vienne airs 4/12 at 5 p.m.—Filmed at the 2013 Jazz a Vienne music festival in France, this concert features Chic and Nile Rodgers as they perform a selection of famous songs by Diana Ross and Sister Sledge, plus a few of their own hits such as "Everybody Dance," "Le Freak" and "Good Times."

<u>Justice in Chester</u> airs 4/23 at 4:30 a.m.—During the 1990s, residents in Chester, Pennsylvania, a predominantly poor African-American community, organized a movement to stop the ongoing permitting of waste treatment facilities in their city. The decades-long history of increasing pollution, grievances and the grassroots struggle to halt the city's clustering of commercial and hazardous waste facilities is chronicled in this documentary.

The Vietnam War airs beginning on 4/13 at 1 p.m.—Ken Burns and Lynn Novick's ten-part, 18-hour documentary series, *The Vietnam War*, tells the epic story of one of the most consequential, divisive, and controversial events in American history as it has never before been told on film. Visceral and immersive, the series explores the human dimensions of the war through revelatory testimony of nearly 80 witnesses from all sides—Americans who fought in the war and others who opposed it, as well as combatants and civilians from North and South Vietnam.

The Misty Experiment: the Secret Battle for the Ho Chi Minh Trail airs 4/20 at 3 p.m.—The story of the special U.S. Air Force squadron whose pilots volunteered for one of the Vietnam War's most dangerous air missions. Their assignment: search for enemy supply transports and anti-aircraft installations concealed within the web of trail paths and waterways collectively known as the Ho Chi Minh Trail. The squadron also directed rescue operations for U.S. and allied aircrews shot down.
